A Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Vail Recreation District, Town of Vail, Eagle County, Colorado, was held on October 27, 2016 at 5:00 p.m. at the Vail Town Council Chambers, Town of Vail, Eagle County, Colorado, in accordance with the applicable statutes of the State of Colorado.

6. CALL TO ORDER

6.1. Director Saalfeld called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

7 CHANGES TO THE AGENDA

7.1. Director Saalfeld stated that the Channel 5 new brand presentation would move up in the schedule to be directly after public input. Director Foley requested that board member input be added as an item under New Business and Special Orders. The rest of the agenda will remain the same as published.

8. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

8.1. By motion duly made and seconded it was unanimously RESOLVED to approve the minutes of the September 22, 2016 meeting. It was noted by Director Saalfeld that due to a scheduling conflict the budget committee was actually comprised of Directors Saalfeld and Kjesbo and not Director Foley as

originally discussed.

9. PUBLIC INPUT FOR MATTERS NOT OTHERWISE ON THE AGENDA

9.1 None

10. CHANNEL 5's NEW BRAND

10.1. Mr. JK Perry and Mr. Mike Griffin presented the new brand for Channel 5 public access television. The station will now be known as High Five Access Media. Mr. Perry and Mr. Griffin gave an overview of the new brand position and a visual tour of the new highfivemedia.org website where viewers can now watch a live stream of the channel and on demand content, including all tapings of Vail Recreation District board of director meetings. They also invited the board and public to a re-creation party on October 28 at Agave restaurant from 1-5 p.m.

11. FINANCIALS SEPTEMBER 2016

11.1. Mr. Weaver stated that there is not a lot new to report with financials. Overall revenues are about \$180,000 favorable compared to budget. The golf course was budgeted to be about 18% down year over year, but they are favorable by about \$61,000 to that forecast, and Dobson is very favorable as well. Almost all departments are favorable in expenses. Overall the District is looking very good financially with some extra balance available to be carried forward into next year. Director Saalfeld commended the Directors for being budget conscious.

12. REVIEW OF PROPOSED 2017 BUDGET

12.1. Mr. Weaver stated that this meeting is the review of the budget and the public hearing will be at the November 10 board meeting. Mr. Weaver stated that Directors Saalfeld and Kjesbo took part in the budget review process with staff to go through the budget in more detail. Mr. Weaver stated that about half of the VRD funding comes from property taxes and the county only revaluates property taxes every other year and this is not one of those years, so the VRD can expect the assessed valuation to be almost flat year over year. Gymnastics is expected to continue on the rebound into 2017, and with the clubhouse construction complete for next year the VRD expects golf revenues to rebound, as well as Dobson to maintain the good revenue from this year. The biggest change will be new golf F&B opportunities with the Grill on the Gore and the banquet room. VRD expects the Grill on the Gore to operate throughout the Nordic season and summer and the banquet room expects to cater events and provide alcohol for events throughout the year. On the expense side, there will be some changes to salaries to meet the new federal minimum salary, and there

has been a restructuring of the benefits plan, with eight new employees being added to the benefits plan. After some discussion, the board thanked Mr. Weaver and the staff for all their work in putting together the budget.

13. VAIL GOLF CLUB UPDATE

13.1. Mr. Ortiz stated that the OAC group met today to try for a TCO on October 28. VRD is hoping to take possession of the building on November 4. The Nordic Center has events on November 10 and 11 to host kids to get fitted for skis for an upcoming trip, so they need to be in as soon as possible. Mr. Ortiz stated that the building is beautiful and the finishes in the Nordic lodge and the building are very nice. The Nordic Center will be hosting a ski swap on November 19.

14. REVIEW AND ADOPTION OF 2017 PROGRAM FEES

14.1. Mr. Ortiz walked the board through the proposed 2017 program fees with assistance from staff on hand to answer questions about programming and fee structures. Many programs will have no changes to fees, with some seeing small increases. Dobson will see a 3% increase for ice rental, and sports is reimagining their trail running registration structure and increasing pay to referees and umpires. Daily golf rates and some pass and punch products will see increases as these prices have not changed in a number of years. There will also be small increases in rental clubs. Proposed rates will be posted on the website and the VRD will run an ad in the paper directing the public to take a look and come to the next meeting if they have input. Nordic fees were discussed and will be increasing slightly based on recommendations from Mr. Shane Sluder and Ms. Mia Stockdale, the Nordic Center owners. By motion duly made and seconded it was unanimously RESOLVED to approve the Nordic Center fee increases as presented. The remaining fees will be discussed and voted on at the November 10 meeting.

15. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR INPUT

- 15.1. Mr. Ortiz shared a video with the Board of one of the gymnastics team participants completing the first double backflip in the history of the Vail Gymnastics program. He thanked the Board for the new floor in the gymnastics center, without which this wouldn't have been possible.
- 15.2. Beyond that, VRD has hosted open enrollment for all benefits-eligible employees, and held the first staff pension board election. He thanked the board for supporting all the employee benefits and programs being put in place.
- 15.3. Director Newbury Rediker asked about the employee party and if that had occurred. It was decided that there would be a VRD staff party once the new

clubhouse opens.

16. BOARD MEMBER INPUT

- 16.1. Director Newbury Rediker stated that she sits on the Commission on Special Events and said that the commission commented on how helpful it was to have Mr. Joel Rabinowitz attend both funding meetings to answer questions. She stated that the CSE was approached by promoters of an international arts festival who would like to have an event on the Ford Park fields, and that the CSE has requested that the festival promoters come to the VRD Board to ask to use the fields. Director Newbury Rediker stated that the VRD Board needs public input to make this decision since there will be impacts to community programming if the event were to occur.
- 16.2. Director Suarez encouraged everyone to check out the new pickleball facilities in Golden Peak.
- 16.3. Director Foley asked about the winter uphill being taken over by the VRD, and if it could be a memorial to Sylvan Ellefson. He also gave kudos to all the VRD staff who participated in the adopt-a-trail program to work on the North Trail in Vail. He asked about the driving range plan, which Mr. Ortiz responded had been tabled by the design review board, and they will go back in November with a new plan. Director Foley also mentioned that he felt it was important to get a meeting between the full VRD Board and the Vail Town Council to start planning for future capital projects.
- 16.4. Director Saalfeld urged taxpayers to vote for Eagle County ballot issue 1B, an extension of a county property tax dedicated to open space.

17.1. Upon a motion duly made and seconded it was unanimously RESOLVED to adjourn the Regular Meeting of the Vail Recreation District Board of Directors.

VAIL RECREATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR REPORTS November 10, 2016

GOLF

- Alice will be attending the Annual PGA Meeting in New York City the week of November 8th. This is the 100th year of the PGA. She will join members of the PGA LEAD Committee in NYC for the meeting. Alice was named to the LEAD Committee in January of 2016, joining 14 other PGA professionals from around the country as part of a two-year commitment to improve our diversity and inclusion into the game of golf.
- The Vail Golf Club will host the USGA Mid Amateur Qualifying in late August of 2017. The Mid Am will be played in Naples, FL the first weekend in October. The competition is a one-day tournament.
- We are placing our merchandise orders for spring of 2017. We plan to carry Adidas, FootJoy, Puma, JoFit, Greyson, Callaway and Cobra.
- We anticipate a good number of our golf operations seasonal staff to return next summer. This will include our golf professionals, Nathan Mead, George Hart, Trey Johnson (will be Class A PGA in the spring) and Ethan Neumann.
- Alice is coaching the Vail Breakaways women's hockey team for the 6th season this year. The Breakaways started in Vail in 1981 and currently compete in the WACH A Division.
- Looking forward to moving into the new clubhouse!

GOLF MAINTENANCE

- All pre-winter tasks have been completed on the golf course: fungicides applied to fairways, tees and greens; irrigation blown out; fairways and greens over seeded; greens roped off, etc.
- Warm weather: we need a rain or snow event weekly, or we may need to hand water some greens from tank/pump setup. Received .3" rain, snowmelt Tuesday the 1st, with another chance this Saturday/Sunday for moisture. Next week (11/7-11) is forecasted to be dry. All extended forecasts showing dry weather pattern through November, hoping for a shift in early December.
- Monitoring weather forecasts for the "shut down, permanent snowcover" event, and coordinating with others on annual Coal Bucket Classic tournament.
- Looking at equipment options for snow removal requirements at new clubhouse/Nordic facility, as well as something that can be used for clearing our greens in March every year.
- Cart path overlays we had hoped to squeeze in this fall have been tabled until spring of 2017 due to continued contractor and equipment unavailability. I did receive a favorable quote though to get most of the paths overlaid next year.
- Range tee renovation plan, phase two, was approved by DRB. We hope to get some preliminary work accomplished before winter sets in, including transplanting the lilacs and removal of the plant beds and rock walls.
- Completion of Gore Creek bank restoration project near #14 back tee in the last part of October will now allow renovation and realignment of the back tee early in

the spring next year. Currently, this tee box points you in the direction of 13 fairway.

SPORTS REPORT

- Staff has been busy scouting some new potential race courses in preparation for our meeting with the Forest Service on 11/15.
- We should have an answer from Vail Resorts on our preferred dates (7/1 or 7/2) for the Hill Climb and on the potential for bringing back a Mtn Bike Series race once every two years on Vail Mtn, after their internal meeting on 11/14.
- Adult open gyms are in full force at Red Sandstone with:
 - o Basketball on Monday
 - o Indoor Soccer on Tuesday
 - o Pickleball on Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday
 - Volleyball on Friday
- Youth volleyball to be coached by BMHS Head Coach Jason Fitzgerald will start on Monday 11/18 and run through the end of January for youth in grades 3-6.
- Following youth volleyball will be multiple sessions of futsal (indoor soccer that will kick off the first week in January).
- Adult basketball and the second session of coed volleyball will start in January.
- Continue to meet with strategic partners and sponsors to finish off this year and start preparing for 2017.
- Congrats to BMHS Girls Cross Country on their recent State Championship!
 Good luck to all the other local high school teams, hopefully who are still playing, in their quest for a fall sports championship.

MARKETING

- Jessie just returned from the Adobe Max creative conference in San Diego. She
 participated in a number of classes and sessions on all kinds of topics from
 graphic design trends to social media, photography and video editing, interactive
 PDFs, and creating 3D images and 360° video. She is full of ideas on new ways
 to promote the District and programs and show off our facilities in new ways.
- Jessie and Nell continue to work on a number of marketing projects including a
 new map and brochure for the Nordic center, a new wedding and events book for
 the clubhouse and many flyers and posters promoting winter activities and
 programs, as well as a number of press releases and emails promoting these
 programs.
- Jessie is working with Suzanne Silverthorn with the Town of Vail on plans to announce the clubhouse opening. She is also preparing for professional photos and videos to be taken of the clubhouse once construction is complete to compliment all current and future marketing efforts. She and Nell are also working on in-house displays for the new A/V monitors and wedding reception area.
- Jessie is working on beefing up our photography library and recently attended an
 after school session to capture some images of the kids at play. She also took a
 number of photos at the Trick or Treat Trot and posted to Facebook (check them
 out there were some really cute costumes!)

PARKS

• All the fields have been put to bed. They have been aereated, overseeded, topdressed, fertilized, sprayed for winter. Winterized facilities, stored equipment.

We replaced the athletic field fence, took out the split rail, removed old golf course fence, and put up black chain link. Fields looked good going into late fall.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

Community Programming

- Imagination Station is fairly busy (three-eight families) every day with some very busy days when weather is bad.
- We continue Gentle Yoga, TRX and Aikido. Aikido is struggling as their instructor moved away earlier this year. They are still meeting, but not very regularly.
- The Nov. 3 Cocktails & Canvas was a large crowd of 27 with all happy customers. We will also host a lantern painting event in December.
- We will host a Parents' Night Out in conjunction with the Friday, Nov. 11 concert and fundraiser for RSES Mesa Verde trip.
- We have had a couple birthday parties in early November and we have five scheduled for the last two weeks in November.

KidZone

- The program is running smoothly and gaining customers as children and families hear about the quality of the program. We are still trying to build our K-1 following.
- We will host three days of School's Out Camp 11/21-23.
- We are providing enrichment to the PwrHrs program in partnership with Youth Power 365/Youth Foundation. We are organizing to provide Nordic for this program beginning in January.

Other

- We are inspecting the skatepark weekly. The TOV is still finalizing warranty issues with the contractor. The TOV streets crew is doing daily maintenance on the skatepark.
- Trick or Treat Trot was a success. Although it felt slightly less busy than previous years, we think we still had 400 or more children.

Vail Recreation District 2017 Preliminary Budget Overview

General Overview

The following is a brief summary of the condensed preliminary budget found on page 2 of the September 30, 2016 financial report.

Revenues

- Taxes- The assessed valuation of the District, after deduction for the Lionshead TIFF, decreased 0.1% as 2017 is not a revaluation year by the County assessor so property taxes will remain relatively consistent between 2016 and 2017. The operations mill levy of the District cannot increase without voter approval so will remain at 2.76 mills and the mill levy dedicated to payment of the Dobson bonds will automatically fluctuate from 0.279 mills to an estimated 0.274 mills for 2017. Specific ownership taxes on motor vehicles are also included in the tax amounts, which are estimated to be 4.9% of property taxes. Deducted from these revenues is the 3% fee for collections withheld by the Eagle County treasurer.
- Other Non-Departmentalized- This includes interest revenues and funds received from lottery ticket sales. Also, like 2013-2016, the District will transfer \$30,000 of the funds available from the forfeiture of non-vested former employee retirement contributions made to them by the District to cover a portion of the District's 2017 retirement contributions to current employees.
- **Sports** 2017 revenues will be relatively comparable to 2016 with some programs expected to have minimal fee increases and increased participation.
- **Gymnastics** This program is on the rebound and we expect this trend to continue into 2017.
- **Community Programming** Most programs did well during 2016 and we expect continued minimal increases for 2017.
- Nature Center & Nordic- Only revenues for sharing of Camp Eco-Fun and from hiking will
 come into Nature Center since we continue to partner with Walking Mountains. Nordic
 revenues expected to increase for 2017 due to increase in the tenant lease rate and program
 fees.
- **Golf-** With construction of the clubhouse complete, revenues are expected to be in line with previous years.
- **Tennis-** Programs and revenues are expected to remain consistent.
- **Dobson-** Revenues in 2015 were bumped up by rink rental and food and beverage sales from the Volvo event. However, programming and food and beverage have done well in 2016 and are generally expected to continue into 2017.
- Golf F&B / Banquet Room- 2017 has major changes as both Grill on the Gore and the banquet room come online. Grill on the Gore revenues are based on extrapolation of the partial year operation in 2015. Banquet room operations are based on booking 25 private events and 5 additional non-profit events.

Operating Expenses

• **Personnel**- To maintain compliance with the Affordable Care Act, the District restructured health insurance benefits and is no offering health insurance to hourly employees who work on a year round basis and average more than 30 hours per week. The District also provided raises to several salaried employees to meet the new minimum pay requirements. Other adjustments include 2.8% to 3% pay increase for most salaries employees as well and increases in hourly wages for seasonal staff. Additional merit bonuses for outstanding performance, if given, would be funded through the contingency line item if the District is able to meet or beat the overall 2017 budget.

- **Administration** 2017 does not have the cost for the election like 2016, other costs are relatively consistent with 2016.
- **Public Relations** Increases for offering benefits to one hourly staff partially offset by savings from philosophy and emphasis changes due to new personnel.
- Park Maintenance- Most items are consistent with 2016, but again budgeting to be fully staffed after running short during certain parts of 2016.
- Facilities Maintenance 2017 budget is consistent with 2016 as there is little room for change due to the majority of expense being payroll and benefit driven.
- **Sports** Increases in revenues produce increased expenses as well, most items generally consistent with 2016.
- **Gymnastics** Adding benefits for one hourly staff position, plus increased revenues cause increased expenses, most items generally consistent with 2016.
- **Community Programming** Adding benefits for one hourly staff position, plus increased revenues cause increased expenses, most items generally consistent with 2016.
- Nature Center & Nordic Will once again pay Walking Mountains a fixed fee to provide programming, plus continue to be responsible for the upkeep of the facility. Nordic expected to increase since back in the clubhouse building.
- **Golf Operations** Increase in expenses since operating out of the clubhouse as compared to the temporary trailers.
- **Golf Maintenance-** Adding benefits for one hourly staff position, plus increased costs for seed, fertilizer, etc.
- **Tennis** Additional expenses for pickleball, most items consistent with 2016.
- Dobson Adding benefits for five hourly staff positions had a dramatic impact on the
 operating expenses. Maintenance costs continued to rise on the aging facility, most of other
 costs consistent with 2016. Expenses include food and beverage as well as general
 operations.
- Golf F&B / Banquet Room- 2017 costs include 3 year-round positions for F&B Manager, Chef, and Events Coordinator, plus hourly staffing costs for operation of Grill on the Gore as well as both food and alcohol services in the banquet room. Also includes higher than normal budgets for marketing and other startup costs.

Debt Service and Capital

- **Debt Service-** The only remaining debt service costs consist of the Dobson bonds, which are paid for through the offsetting property tax mill levy.
- Capital- 2017 capital centers around routine and needed projects and replacements (equipment, vehicles, routine building maintenance, etc), redoing the driving range tees, as well as planning dollars for both 2 bridges on the golf course (shared 50/50 with the Town) and the starter building. Costs also include 10% for contingency.
- **Contingency** With the clubhouse completed in 2016, reduced back down to normal \$100,000 for unforeseen swings in revenues or expenses.

Fund Balance- The 2017 budget calls for ending fund balance to be roughly \$2,950,000, with \$1,450,000 of such being assigned to future capital spending (primarily the starter house remodel project, bridges, and a long list of other projects for which \$1.45M is not sufficient to complete) to allow the District to maintain the goal of \$1.5 Million for operations (\$300,000 for restricted for the Dobson Bonds, \$100,000 is restricted for emergencies by TABOR, and the remaining \$1.1Million is equal to roughly 3 months of operating expenses).
