Minutes of the Regular Meeting Of the Board of Directors

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Vail Recreation District, Town of Vail, Eagle County, Colorado, was held on January 14, 2016 at 5:00 p.m. at the Vail Town Council Chambers, Town of Vail, Eagle County, Colorado, in accordance with the applicable statutes of the St ate of Colorado.

6. CALL TO ORDER

6.1. Director Saalfeld called the meeting to order at 5:03 p.m.

7. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

7.1. By motion duly made and seconded it was RESOLVED to approve the minutes of the December 10, 2015 meeting.

8. PUBLIC INPUT OF ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

- 8.1. Mr. Sackbauer wanted to thank the board and staff for adding winter pickleball open gym on Thursdays and Saturdays at Red Sandstone Elementary. He commended Mr. Jerry Stevens for his knowledge and operations expertise, and thanked Mr. O'Connell for addressing the lighting issue in the gym.
 - 8.1.1. Director Newbury questioned how many people have been attending the open gyms on average.

- 8.1.2. Mr. Sackbauer stated there have been between 18-20 people, with all three courts full, with beginners to advanced players. He noted that Mr. Stevens has been great at orienting new players.
- 8.2. Mr. Sluder of the Vail Nordic Center requested to be included in any upcoming fat bike meetings.
 - 8.2.1. Director Foley questioned if fat biking at the Nordic Center would work.
 - 8.2.2. Mr. Sluder said that he doesn't believe it would with how the Nordic Center is set up currently.
 - 8.2.3. Director Suarez questioned if he would be willing to make a presentation to the board, and Mr. Sluder agreed.
- 8.3. Mr. O'Connell wanted to thank the board for their kindness and generosity over the holidays and everything they do to take care of the VRD staff.

9. LEGAL MATTERS

- 9.1. 2016 Meeting Dates and Meeting Notice Posting Locations
 - 9.1.1. Mr. Weaver explained as required by state statute the board is required to set the regular meeting dates and meeting posting locations at the first meeting of the year. Meeting dates will be held at 5 p.m. the second and fourth Thursday of each month, with the exception of the last meetings in November and December due to the holidays.
 - 9.1.2. Mr. Ortiz explained that the meeting notices are required to be posted at three locations, which include the Town of Vail Municipal Building, Vail Golf Club and Vail Recreation District Administrative Office. Additional courtesy postings include Dobson Ice Arena and online at vailrec.com.
 - 9.1.3. Director Wiles recused himself from the vote due to his limited tenure remaining.
 - 9.1.4. By motion duly made and seconded it was RESOLVED to approve the set VRD Board meeting dates for second and fourth Thursday of each month and to approve the meeting posting locations at the Town of Vail Municipal Building, Vail Golf Club and the Vail Recreation District Administrative Offices.

10. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MARCHETTI & WEAVER, LLC ENGAGEMENT

- 10.1. Mr. Weaver stated that there has been a change in accounting rules, and CPA's can now "prepare" financial statements, where the page of disclosures is removed and replaced with a footnote that there is no assurance provided on the financials. Mr. Weaver said that most boards are moving to this standard to save paper.
- 10.2. Director Suarez questioned if there was any downside besides saving paper, Mr. Weaver replied no.
- 10.3. Director Foley commended Marchetti and Weaver on past performance and making the reports easy to read.

10.4. By motion duly made and seconded it was unanimously RESOLVED to approve the engagement letter with Marchetti & Weaver dated January 11, 2016.

11. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF WEDDING ISLAND PRICING 2016

- 11.1. Mr. O'Connell explained this is the second season with the Vail Golf Course wedding island back under the VRD realm of responsibility with seven successful weddings last year, during both off peak and on peak seasons.
- 11.2. Mr. O'Connell reviewed the proposed wedding island pricing with the board and after answering multiple questions from the Board and giving a brief overview of the operations of the island by the golf staff, by motion duly made and seconded it was unanimously RESOLVED to approve the wedding island pricing as presented.

12. 2015 PRELIMINARY NOVEMBER FINANCIALS

12.1. Mr. Weaver stated there was not much change since the last report. He is still forecasting that the VRD will finish about \$200,000 ahead for the year and may even increase once December closes. He highlighted the Volvo event at Dobson as putting the Ice Arena in the black for the first time in years. December will be most important to see where we stand, which will be presented at the next Board meeting.

13. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR INPUT

- 13.1. Mr. Ortiz stated that Scott Todd recently gave a presentation to the PEC on water quality management that was well received. There was also some direction given to keep monitoring things on the golf course and they'd like Mr. Todd to be more involved in a group with the town.
- 13.2. Alice Plain has been selected to take part in the PGA lead program, which includes 14 golf pros from the around the country. This is a big honor for Ms. Plain.
- 13.3. Golf club staff will be working with Red Sandstone Elementary students to teach golf in schools for the fourth grade.
- 13.4. Three pickleball courts are up at Red Sandstone now, with open gym on Thursday night and Saturday mornings. All winter leagues are now in full swing. Participation is similar to last year.
- 13.5. Dobson had 30 U-8 program players skate at the Avalanche game on December 27. This was the second largest program in the state.
- 13.6. The annual SCV holiday show went well.
- 13.7. There was good participation in the holiday KidZone School's Out Camp.
- 13.8. Mr. Young has been working hard with the Youth Foundation to take kids out to the Nordic Center as part of the PwrHrs program at Red Sandstone Elementary.
- 13.9. There were 75 kids at Santa's Workshop and a recent cocktails and canvas was well attended with 18 participants.

13.10. The cart barn framing at the golf course is going well, and conceptual plans are in progress for the old 18 green and the new driving range tee which will include a section of artificial surface.

14. BOARD MEMBER INPUT



- 14.2. Director Wiles expressed his excitement of having a baseball tournament return to Vail this summer.
- 14.3. Director Foley hopes we can find a spot for the Kreuger Family Shamrock Shuffle. He also attended the skating show and said it was phenomenal, kudos to all involved. He reminded the board of the January 28 open house at Red Sandstone Elementary School and invited the public to attend.
- 14.4. Director Suarez also attended the skating show and was very impressed, he questioned how the VRD could help the skating club even more beyond donating the ice time for the show. He also had a question about the 18th green proposal and if we were going to be given some options, this was confirmed. He liked the idea of giving a college scholarship, and apologized for his comment about tennis courts not being locked at the last meeting, he confirmed that they are being locked. He also questioned Mr. Weaver if we could get a cost breakdown on the election costs of doing a mail-in ballot versus a polling place election.
- 14.5. Director Saalfeld also went to the skating show and thanked the Skating Club of Vail. He also would like more marketing of pickleball and community activities to guests from out of town. Director Foley mentioned that they have been listed daily in the Vail Daily calendar.

A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR THE 2016 REGULAR DISTRICT ELECTION AND APPOINTING A DESIGNATED ELECTION OFFICIAL

WHEREAS, the Vail Recreation District ("District") is a quasi-municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Colorado and a duly organized and existing special district pursuant to Title 32, Colorado Revised Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the terms of office of Directors Jeff Wiles and Billy Suarez shall expire after their successors are elected at the regular special district election to be held on May 3, 2016 ("Election") and have taken office; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Special District Act ("Act") and the Colorado Local Government Election Code ("Code") (the Act and the Code being referred to jointly as the "Election Laws"), the Election must be conducted to elect two (2) Directors to serve for a term of four (4) years.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Vail Recreation District in the County of Eagle, State of Colorado that:

- 1. The regular election of the eligible electors of the District shall be held on May 3, 2016, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. pursuant to and in accordance with the Election Laws, and other applicable laws. At that time, two (2) Directors will be elected to serve a four-year term.
- 2. There shall be one election precinct for the convenience of the eligible electors of the District, the boundaries of which shall be identical to the boundaries of the District, and there shall be one polling place at the following location(s):

Grand View Room 395 E. Lionshead Circle Vail, CO 81657

situated in the County of Eagle, State of Colorado. The polling place located at 395 E. Lionshead Circle shall also be the polling place for disabled electors and for eligible electors not residing within the District. If the Designated Election Official deems it to be more expedient for the convenience of the eligible electors of the District (who are also eligible electors in other special districts with overlapping boundaries which are conducting elections on the Election day), the Election may be held jointly with such special districts in accordance with coordinated election procedures as set forth in an agreement between all participating special districts. In such event, the election precincts and polling places shall be as set forth in such agreement. The Designated Election

Official is authorized to execute such agreement on behalf of the District, which agreement shall include provisions for the allocation of responsibilities for the conduct and reasonable sharing of costs of the coordinated Election.

Applications for absentee ballots may be filed with the Designated Election Official at 700 S. Frontage Rd E, Vail, CO 81657, no later than the close of business on the Friday immediately preceding the election (Friday, April 29, 2016).

- 3. Self-Nomination and Acceptance forms are available at the Designated Election Official's office located at the above address. All candidates must file a Self-Nomination and Acceptance form with the Designated Election Official no earlier than January 1, 2016, nor later than the close of business on Friday, February 26, 2016.
- 4. If the only matter before the electors is the election of Directors of the District and if, at the close of business on March 1, 2016, there are not more candidates than offices to be filled at the Election, including candidates timely filing affidavits of intent no later than February 29, 2016, the Designated Election Official shall cancel the Election and declare the candidates elected. Notice of such cancellation shall be published and posted in accordance with the Code.
- 5. If any part or provision of this Resolution is adjudged to be unenforceable or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Resolution, it being the Board's intention that the various provisions hereof are severable.
- 6. Any and all actions previously taken by the Designated Election Official, the Secretary of the Board of Directors, or any other persons acting on their behalf pursuant to the Election Laws or other applicable laws, are hereby ratified and confirmed.
- 7. All acts, orders, and resolutions, or parts thereof, of the Board which are inconsistent or in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency or conflict.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT VARIANCES:

GYMNASTICS REVENUES- Numbers are down but are coming back with program and staff rebuilding

GOLF REVENUES- Positive variances at Grill on the Gore and great late season weather produced positive variances

DOBSON REVENUES- The Volvo event was huge for the arena, both in facility rental and concessions. Bob Johnson had another successful year as well.

FUND BALANCE- Savings at end of 2014 rolled forward to 2015.

VAIL RECREATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR REPORTS February 11, 2016

GOLF MAINTENANCE

- Nordic trails in great shape. Settled base of 36" at our weather station by 3 green as
 of today. We are roughly 15% above average snowpack for the Colorado River
 Basin year to date.
- Scott and Justin will be attending the Golf Industry Show the week of the 8th, attending seminars on Monday and Tuesday, and the trade show on Wednesday and Thursday.
- An article will be appearing in an upcoming issue of Golf Course Management magazine, produced by GCSAA, as well as other industry publications, detailing our 2015 recertification in the Audubon International Cooperative Golf Course Sanctuary program. The article, written by the Audubon Steward that toured the course and facilities last June to assess our practices, highlights our environmentally conscious management strategies. Later this spring, I will work with Jessie on an article to be released in the local news publications.
- Later this month, several of us plan to visit a couple of the Nordic facilities in our area that host fat tire biking, to assess whether it might be an option for us in the future.
- Just completed 2-day seminar, "Actively Green", put on by Walking Mountains
 Science and Nature School covering the process on how to get our organization
 certified as "Actively Green". This distinction is bestowed upon organizations
 working on, and towards sustainability practices that are environmentally friendly,
 socially and morally responsible, and have a positive economic benefit to all.

GOLF OPERATIONS

- Staff had a busy, productive week at the PGA Merchandise Show. We met with sales reps, placed orders, looked at artificial turf options and met with PGM Coordinators. Alice met several times with the "LEAD" group that she was recently selected for. The "LEAD" group was formed by the National PGA to bring Diversity and Inclusion to the forefront of golf. The next meeting will be in NYC in November for the National PGA Meeting.
- Staff met this week at Red Sky GC with local PGA Professionals about our 2016 plan for our First Tee Players League. We plan to continue our relationship with the First Tee and introduce a new program called the PGA Players League designed for junior 13 and under. The information on this program can be found at PGA Junior League. For our 14-18 year old juniors we plan to collaborate and have a Tournament Series of 9 hole individual stroke play events throughout the summer.
- Ed Wisneski, a friend, and longtime seasonal employee at the Vail Golf Club passed away on Jan 25th. Ed battled a rare disease and he valiantly was fighting the last 3 years. He will be missed! Carolyn plans to work one more season at the VGC.

- In addition to being nominated for three West Chapter PGA Awards this year, Alice was recently nominated for two Colorado PGA Chapter Awards: Merchandiser of the Year and the Youth Player Development Award.
- Alice is putting together all merchandise orders for 2016. The temporary doublewide has a significant amount of room for displays and retail.
- New golf cars have been ordered. These will not have GPS Units in the carts because of cost. We plan to replace all yardage discs for 100, 150,200 in the fairways.

SPORTS REPORT

- Sports Department met with Vail Mountain Operations regarding the VRD's summer events on the mountain and how the opening of Epic Discovery will affect them. As a result, staff is looking into options to move dates and locations for a number of trail running races as well as the Vail Grind. This needs to be finished by March 15 to meet USFS and BLM permit deadlines.
- Joel is championing the implementation of Max Galaxy, an integrated, VRD-wide online registration and scheduling system slated to go live on April 4.
- The Sports Department will be timing the Eagle Valley HS Nordic Meet on Saturday 2/6. It is a pursuit race with multiple disciplines requiring individual and combined times and has required us to expand our minds and timing capabilities.
- Working with Jen Mason to promote and produce the VAC Vail Mountain Winter Uphill on 2/20. This is the event that Ellen Miller started in memory of Lyndon Ellefson.
- Partnering with TOV to help promote Sole Power, an eco-friendly commuter initiative.
- Staff recommends supporting the VVMBA "adopt-a-ranger" campaign as we are one of the biggest users of our local trail system for events. Board should expect info from VVMBA reps (Jamie Malin) shortly.
- TOV event permit has been approved for the Krueger Family Shamrock Shuffle on 3/15. Event will start at the Vail Athletic Fields and end at the Vail Nature Center with a bon fire, hot chocolate and s'mores. The event is a partnership between sports and the nature center/walking mountains science school.
- High Country Hoops registration continues and starts the first week of March.
- Planning for Sports Spectacular youth program underway.
- Spring Soccer registration will begin next week.
- The countdown to event season has begun...12 weeks to the first short track race!

MARKETING

- Summer planning is in full swing with media buys and graphic collateral creation, including a full media plan to promote the new clubhouse as a meeting and wedding venue, and numerous summer camp guide placements, plus trail running series advertising.
- Collateral was created and distributed for upcoming kids night out with community programming.

- Press releases and emails sent out for High Country Hoops, Parents' Night Out (and reminders), pickleball, the upcoming chocolate making workshop, Superbowl Sunday Funday, and the VRD was included in the most recent VCBA and VVP newsletters.
- Working on creating an internal photo, logo, video and collateral library to organize all VRD marketing assets for easy sharing with media and advertising partners, as well as identifying visual needs for the future.
- The VRD was featured in a recent Vail Valley Home magazine five-page spread on the new golf clubhouse and Nordic Center (February issue). We also had coverage of the Parents' Night Out programs (1/15, 1/16, 1/22) and Nordic Center feature (1/17) plus daily calendar events and a few Town Talk mentions.
- The VRD website server has been upgraded to prepare for development of the new site.

DOBSON

- George and Robyn's pair's team who skate out of Westminster finished 2nd at Nationals at the Intermediate Level. This is a huge accomplishment for both the skaters and coaches. The pair's team also skated in our annual skating show over the holidays.
- Program numbers for January are average with the exception of our new Bridge Program. We have 4 skaters participating in that for the first time. The Bridge Program is for Basic Level skaters looking to up their game in figure skating.
- Adult Hockey Leagues are full.
- We currently have 114 under-8 hockey players playing in Dobson Arena. This is astronomically high for Vail. This is partially due to a new program marketed by the Avalanche called the Mile High Mites. We had 29 participants join as part of that program which is in addition to our regular annual program. Our staff, Andy Holland, Ronnie Crocket and Brian Gordon, along with Tara Lane are helping coach the new 6 week program. Other coaches include Vail legend Tee Fox.
- Jared has met with the Hispanic Event Promoters and we are looking at our first show in April along with 4-5 more through September. The amount may double from the number of shows we did last year.

PARKS MAINTENANCE

 Nothing new at the parks department, in the winter mode, setting Nordic, snow shoe, and snow removal.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

Community Programming

- Traffic continues to be busy at Imagination Station, although not to the extent we saw over the holidays. We 5 to 10 families per day and many Paint Your Own Pottery participants.
- We recently lost our Aikido instructor, but the group plans to keep training in more of a club format. AcroYoga is thriving, and we have quite a few new yoga participants. TRX is steady. We cancelled Zumba due to lack of interest.
- We have series of Parents' Night Out programs through Imagination Station. We had
 a light attendance on the first programs. From parent suggestion, we added a
 SuperBowl event on Sunday, 2/7. Reservations are light, but we will let you know
 about last-minute additions. We have another event Saturday 2/13 with significant
 reservations already.

 Cocktails & Canvas: Chocolate Making will take place on Friday 2/12. This has a capacity of 20 and is nearly full, and will almost certainly fill by 2/12.

- We hosted one Day of School's Out Camp on Monday, 1/18. We will host five days
 of School's Out Camp over the February break. Thanks to Jerrica for a great
 schedule.
- The VRD is proud to coordinate with the Youth Foundation on their Power Hours at RSES. Chad and Dan Weiland worked hard to coordinate Nordic for the children beginning in January. Chad and Christian Kloser got the kids out on snow the first week of January, and the program was a resounding success. Youth Foundation has approved an additional 7 weeks of Nordic with the RSES PwrHrs children. This program will continue through March and as far into April as snow will allow.

Other

- Chad, Jared, Joel, Julie and Jessie have agreed to move forward with Max Galaxy as a unified database and online registration portal for all VRD programming.
- We have begun to recruit and interview for summer positions.
- We have begun to plan summer programming. We have some new and interesting ideas to produce more revenue in 2016.
