Minutes of the Regular Meeting Of the Board of Directors

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Vail Recreation District, Town of Vail, Eagle County, Colorado, was held on September 28, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. at the Vail Town Council Chambers, Town of Vail, Eagle County, Colorado, in accordance with the applicable statutes of the State of Colorado.

- 10.1. Mr. Ortiz talked about how at the Sept. 7 special meeting the VRD Board certified Ballot Issue A. Ballots will be going out via mail on Oct. 16 for the Nov. 7 election. Ballots can be requested through VRD if an eligible voter does not receive one. Ballots may be returned via mail or can be dropped off at the Vail Recreation District administration offices, located inside the Vail Tennis Center at 700 S Frontage Rd E in Vail, or to the District's Designated Election Official at 28 2nd St., Suite 213 in Edwards, up until 7 p.m. on November 7. On election day there will also be a drop-off at the Town of Vail Municipal Building. Mr. Ortiz reminded voters this is a mail-in ballot election due to being a TABOR question. Mr. Weaver stated the TABOR notices went out this week and no con statements were received.
- 10.2. Mr. Ortiz then gave a presentation regarding the VRD financials, and how the VRD operating mill levy has not increased in 24 years. The mill levy was only intended to cover operating expenses and was not meant for the capital needs the District now faces. Due to a substantial increase in programming and maintenance of new facilities over the past 24 years, the VRD is struggling to keep up with costs, plus state law – including the Gallagher Amendment and TABOR laws - have constrained the funding available to the District. Over the next 10 years the VRD will face a \$14 million shortage on funding capital obligations, and in an effort to keep from having to increase user fees, the VRD is asking for a modest tax increase of 1.0 mills. The additional cost on a home that is valued at \$500,000 will be \$36 per year. Mr. Ortiz then reminded the Board and viewers of all the facilities and programs the VRD now operates, including the Vail Golf Club, Dobson Ice Arena, Vail Tennis Center, Golden Peak Pickleball Center, Vail Gymnastics Center, Vail Athletic Fields, Vail Nordic Center, Imagination Station and Community Programming Room, Vail Nature Center, after-school programs and summer day camps, adult sports leagues, Zeke M. Pierce Skatepark, Vail Whitewater Race Series, Vail Town Series mountain bike racing, La Sportiva Vail Trail Series, summer youth sports camps and special events and tournaments such as the Easter Egg Hunt, Trick or Treat Trot and many more. The full presentation can be found via a link on the VRD website, at www.vailrec.com/elections.
- 10.3. Director Suarez stated the Board does not want to raise user fees, hence the need for the mill levy increase.
- 10.4. Director Saalfeld stated the Board has been fiscally responsible in the operations budgets and the main purpose of the mill levy increase would be to fund capital improvements to keep facilities modern and safe and keep recreation as affordable to users as possible.

11. AUGUST 2017 FINANCIALS

11.1. Mr. Weaver spoke about the District financials for the year and said the trends VRD has seen throughout the year have continued through August. The biggest

line item is the golf F&B expenses and banquet room. Things are going very well there – with revenues up, but with increase revenues come additional costs for food and staffing. Mr. Weaver stated that capital expenses for the year are a little favorable, due to a contingency built in that has not been needed so far. He expects both operations and capital budgets to finish the year close to forecast.

11.2. Mr. Weaver also spoke about the 2018 budget and said he will be preparing two budget scenarios for next year – one for if the mill levy passes and another if it does not pass. The second week in November will be the final budget approval, which comes one week after the election. If the election doesn't pass, Mr. Weaver stated the scenario will be pretty dire.

12. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

- 12.1. Mr. Ortiz talked about the Nordic Center and how he's excited Mr. Dan Timm will be running it this year. They are already talking about signage and maps. Mr. Ortiz is excited for the opportunity to get local school kids out to the Nordic Center, like they do with the school golf program. They recently had a team night at the Nordic Center and local students were very excited to buy equipment at cost. A number of passes have already been sold for the winter and Mr. Timm is working with Vail Resorts to use the soccer field as a teaching
- 12.2. Mr. Ortiz also stated that VRD has been given approval from Vail Resorts to use the Golden Peak Ski School building next summer for all summer camps Camp Eco Fun, Pre Kamp Vail and Camp Vail since there will be major construction at Red Sandstone Elementary School next summer where some camps are usually held. Thanks to Vail Resorts and also the State of Colorado for licensing the whole facility. Mr. Ortiz also stated that Vail Mountain School was gracious and welcoming, however it will be great to have all camps in the same location.

13. BOARD MEMBER INPUT

- 13.1. Director Newbury Rediker thanked the Vail Chamber & Business Association and the golf and sports staff for the recent BB&B tournament. She said it went really well and people had a great time raising money for the Tom Slaughter, Jr. Memorial Youth Recreation Fund. She also told a story about the recent housekeeping week at the Antlers to do something fun altogether as a staff, and how they did Paint your Own Pottery at the Community Programming Room. She reminded everyone that VRD offers so much to the community both for kids and adults alike.
- 13.2. Director Suarez thanked Mr. Bob Seward for 18 years at the Vail Tennis Center and stated that he is retiring after this season.
- 13.3. Director Saalfeld also thanked Mr. Seward for all his hard work over the past years. He asked about operations at the clubhouse, which are going to stop Oct.

22, and next week they'll be aerifying the course. On Nov. 1 VRD plans to open the Nordic shop, and will open the ski and snowshoe tracks once 18" of snow cover allows grooming to start. The restaurant will open along with the Nordic track, in stages. Mr. Saalfeld also asked about the banquet business, and was told it is doing great. Revenues are favorable to budget, but with a first-year operation there are always expenses that aren't planned for. Next year, every Saturday and many Sundays in the fall are already booked. Mr. Saalfeld stated that the clubhouse is an exciting new thing for Vail that is bringing in people to town who are spending money and paying sales tax to the town.

RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE BALLOT ISSUE AT THE NOVEMBER 7, 2017 SPECIAL ELECTION

RECITALS

- A. The Vail Park and Recreation District ("**VRD**") is a quasi-municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Colorado (the "**State**") and a duly organized and existing special district pursuant to Title 32, Article 1, C.R.S.
- B. The Board of Directors of VRD (the "**Board**") has determined that the interest of VRD and the public interest and necessity require that VRD increase its property tax levy.
- C. The Board further has determined that it is necessary to submit to the eligible electors of VRD the question of authorizing VRD to increase its property tax levy at the election to be held on November 7, 2017 as "Ballot Issue A".
- D. VRD operates and manages facilities and provides services to the Vail community. Since VRD was created as a special district separate from the Town of Vail, it has substantially increased programming and taken management of new facilities to keep up with growing resident and guest demand. This has resulted in increased costs.
- E. Under its current tax constraints, VRD faces a gap in its ability to pay the costs of capital replacement. The existing levy was intended to cover operation costs only, not capital replacement; and this operating tax rate has not been increased in the 24 years that VRD has grown. This tax increase is designed to enable VRD to pay for capital replacement as the needs arise.
- F. VRD operates the Vail Golf Club, Dobson Ice Arena, Vail Tennis Center, Vail Nordic Center, Vail Gymnastics Center, Golden Peak Pickleball Center, Zeke M. Pierce Skatepark, Vail Athletic Fields, Imagination Station and Community Programming Room, Vail Nature Center, after-school programs and open gyms at Red Sandstone Elementary School, summer day camps and sports camps, adult sports leagues, trail running, mountain biking and whitewater races, art and fitness classes and many of Vail's favorite family events and tournaments.
- G. Without this increase, rates would have to be increased 35 percent across the board, which means an annual silver golf pass now costing \$1,000 would increase to \$1,350; a softball team's fees would increase from \$585 to \$789.75 and one day of youth summer camp would increase from \$55 to \$74. These higher rates would make many of our programs unaffordable to many of our constituents.
- H. New funding would keep the facilities and operations environmentally friendly for residents and guests, and align VRD with the Town of Vail's Sustainable Destination designation. Examples of this include replacing the inefficient chiller system at Dobson Ice Arena, updating the restrooms at the Vail Athletic Field, and pursuing solar power and energy saving programs at each of the VRD facilities.

- I. Keeping VRD's rates affordable will add to Vail's sense of community by preserving affordable recreational and educational opportunities for Vail's residents, children and working families.
- J. The money would replace outdated equipment and address the major repair backlog to upgrade and renovate facilities, such as updating the bleachers, scoreboards, sound system and concession at Dobson Ice Arena; the starter house and bridges at the Vail Golf Club; kids' exhibits at the Imagination Station; and the old Vail Tennis Center building.
- K. A yes vote on Ballot Issue A is a vote to preserve affordable recreational opportunities for all of Vail's residents and guests, and to upgrade and maintain safe and modern facilities for generations to come.
- L. If passed, Ballot Issue A will provide VRD with an extra 1.000 mill levy, which results in an annual tax increase of \$36 for a house worth \$500,000.
- M. It is the opinion of the Board of Directors of VRD that increasing its property tax levy will promote the health, safety and welfare of the entire community.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Vail Park and Recreation District in the County of Eagle, State of Colorado that:

- 1. The above and foregoing Recitals are incorporated herein by reference and are adopted as findings and determinations of the Board.
- 2. The Board recommends that every elector give VRD's Ballot Issue A serious consideration and strong support on November 7.
- 3. VRD officials are authorized and directed to take all actions necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution, and to make this Resolution available to the public.

VAIL RECREATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR REPORTS

October 12, 2017

GOLF

- Golf Operations staff worked with the maintenance staff on Thursday October 5th with green aerification. We had ten staff helping with the all-day project, including Alice. With the help of the golf ops staff, maintenance was able to complete all of the greens in the one day.
- Our pace of play averages for the month of June this season was 4 hours and 10 minutes. July was 4 hours and 8 minutes. We are still calculating August and September. Many of the morning rounds were 3 hours and 45 minutes which helped the overall averages. We had good feedback this summer with our pace of play program.
- Staff attended the PGA West Chapter meeting at Aspen Glen this week. Alice is now on the West Chapter Board for three years. This was her first meeting of her term. She arranged the education portion and had Ross Iverson from the Vail Centre present. Nathan Mead and Trey Johnson played in the two day West Chapter Championship tournament.
- Staff will attend the annual PGA fall merchandise show in Denver on October 11th. This will be the start of the merchandise buying for 2018.
- Through Saturday October 7th, we are 300 rounds shy of 24,000 rounds for the year. I would expect we will reach 24,000 by the end of the year. We lost a few days of golf with early snow fall and aerification. The planned golf course closing date is October 22nd, weather permitting.
- Staff is already working on detailing golf carts, staining all our wooden, outdoor fixtures (bag stands, racks and podiums) to be ready for winter storage.
- All golf equipment and merchandise is on sale now. Great deals available from 20-40% off in the golf shop.

GOLF MAINTENANCE

- Busy event season wrapped up on September 28th, with the fund raiser tourney for Kara Woods. Weather was not ideal, but the course was in good condition and the event was a success.
- Aeration of fairways and tees was completed over the period from September 18-27.
- Greens were core-aerated, deep-tined, and top-dressed on October 5th. Originally we had planned on doing this on the 4th but had to push it back a day due to snow on the 2nd and 3rd and the resulting 1.25"-1.75" of rain and snowmelt that resulted from the west to east end of the course. I would like to thank Alice, Nate, George, Trey, Cole, John, Mike, and several others from Alice's staff that helped us out with cleaning plugs off of the greens that day, a long day for all involved.
- Greens will require additional sand topdressings between now and the end of the
 month, but we won't "bury them" to fill all the holes until two pre-winter snowmold
 fungicide applications are completed. Topdressing them with sand heavily
 before spraying could negatively affect fungicide efficacy.

- The tees still need to be sand top-dressed, which we plan to begin this week after the snow melts and tee surfaces dry out enough to be able to.
- We were able to start slit-seeding fairways today, the 9th, but are delayed until the 10th or 11th due to this latest snow.
- The fairways and tees will be treated with snowmold fungicides after they have been seeded, and based on weather forecasts. The idea is to wait as late as possible this month to apply, to extend fungicide efficacy as far through the winter and into next spring as possible.
- Compressor for blowing out irrigation system has been ordered and is scheduled to arrive the 24th, so we will be doing this 1-2 day procedure after the course has closed for the season (23rd)
- Gore Creek has been propped back up lately, flowing in the 30's and 40 cfs range as a result of the rains and snows we have received recently. With snow up high now, we should not have to worry about irrigation restrictions any longer, even if we get into a prolonged dry period between now and irrigation system winterization.
- With the rains and snows, we have been able to mostly refill the ponds on 1, 2, 8, and 9 from our irrigation system in the last 10 days, and we'll continue to do so as weather and pond levels allow and dictate.
- We still have budgeted money left to spend on cart paths following the asphalt overlays completed in May. I am hopeful to get a contractor in to do some crack sealing before the end of the season.

SPORTS REPORT

- Finished the bike season with (2) Cyclocross Races at the Eagle Fairgrounds.
 Still a bit of a fringe sport in this valley but the 30 or so racers each night were greatly appreciative.
- We were hired to time the Outlier Bike Festival Cross Country Race on Vail Mountain.
- We timed and produced the Great Stampede 1 & # mile race at Wild West Days benefitting the Education Foundation of Eagle County.
- Helping BMHS with 2 upcoming events Zombie Run in Eagle Vail on 10/15 benefiting the FBLA and the Color Run on 10/21 benefitting the Athletic Booster Club.
- Open Gym at Red Sandstone have started with Basketball on Mondays and Volleyball on Fridays, both from 6-9 pm. Drop in Soccer will be added on Tuesday nights when the Mountain opens.
- Wrapping up the summer with equipment cleaning, storage, repair and recapping with our partners and sponsors.
- Have submitted a proposal to CSE for continued funding of the White Water Series
- Beth and Joel returned from NRPA with some good knowledge and networking from the different education sessions we attended.
- Vail Valley Soccer Club tournament was this past weekend, with 150 teams participating. We helped them with field prep, scheduling and logistics.
- Working on our winter event schedule. Currently on the books
